Previously, I shared that ALRV had applied for a grant from Towson Communities Alliance (TCA) in order to replace the Village sign that was destroyed on Putty Hill. I'm delighted to announce that we

received the grant. The grant provides a percentage of funds for the project and ALRV will need to add the remaining funds. We are very appreciative of TCA for selecting us as grant recipients and we are excited to move this project forward.

ALRV contacted the Mackenzie group (former Bel-Loc/Starbucks location agents), County Code Enforcement and Baltimore County police to address landscape overgrowth problems and graffiti on the former Starbucks building. We are grateful that the issues were addressed and the graffiti removed very quickly. The building is still for sale and to date, we do not have further updates. We contacted Saul Centers regarding an instance of graffiti and concern about the overall management of the Ravenwood Plaza shopping center. As yet, they have not responded. However, the graffiti has been removed. We subsequently contacted Code Enforcement regarding the overgrowth that was obstructing the sidewalks and alleyway and appreciate their help in correcting some of these concerns. ALRV board members also represent Loch Raven Village as part of a committee of surrounding communities for the Towson Marketplace. New restaurants coming to Towson Place include Ledo's Pizza, First Watch, Panda Express as well as Navy Federal Credit Union.

As the ALRV board continues to focus on ways to enhance life in the Village, we are



Currently, there are many large gaps in our tree canopy in LRV. Transit Plan Feedback Opportunity

The Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Transit Administration (MDOT MTA) is excited to announce the start of the public feedback period for the newest Regional Transit Plan (RTP) Corridor Study between Towson and Downtown Baltimore.

After receiving over 500 comments in summer 2022 on the first RTP East-West Corridor Study connecting Bayview to Ellicott City, we are now asking for your thoughts on a potential future Metro, Light Rail, or Bus Rapid Transit line connecting North-South destinations in the Baltimore region. MDOT MTA, Baltimore City, and Baltimore County have been studying seven potential new transit options (called preliminary alternatives) that would best serve the high transit demand in this corridor. We need your feedback to help us decide which ones (or combinations of them) should move forward to the next phase of study.

Why Be a Block Captain?

Have you ever wondered about the role of an LRV block captain? Perhaps you've considered volunteering but weren't sure what it entailed. Block captains play an important role in our community and are part of what makes LRV a warm, welcoming neighborhood. If you've noticed signs decorated with wreaths at Christmastime or had the pleasure of reading The Village Crier which was delivered right to your door, you can probably thank your block captain! As a block captain you can choose the level to which you wish to volunteer.

Block Captains...

- Decorate the street (or their designated portion of the street) with wreaths at Christmastime.
- Welcome new neighbors and notify the Welcome Committee when a new resident joins the street (and, if willing, bring an ALRV "welcome basket" to the new neighbor).

Block Captains MAY also...

- · Help deliver The Village Crier.
- Help deliver important or urgent notices from the ALRV board.
- Organize a block party.
- Help choose winners for the holiday decorating contests.
- Encourage residents to pay their dues.
- Provide neighbors with community information and resources. It is not the block captain's responsibility to verify ALRV or Baltimore County rules or requirements.

 Block captains may "point the way" to help find the information, but it is up to the individual to contact the proper authority and confirm accuracy.
- Provide email contact information to neighbors via the website and The Village Crier.



Block Captains are not...

- Facilitators of disputes between neighbors.
- · Law enforcement or vigilantes.
- Enforcers or authorities on county or ALRV community codes and covenants.
