The ALRV is continuing to file code enforcement complaints with Baltimore County, necessary. When we are aware of residences or commercial locations that are overgrown with weeds. trash strewn, rodent infested, etc., we have been and will continue to file complaints with Baltimore County Code Enforcement. The County will send an inspector on fairly quick timing and issue correction notices, and if necessary, fines. If you are aware of a problem property you can go online yourself at (https:// baltimorecountymd.citysourced.us/ servicerequests/create#/) Complaints can be filed anonymously if you wish to do so.

As always, we have opportunities for residents to become more involved and play an important role in preserving Loch Raven Village as one of the best communities to live in.


